
I met Fatima at the 1988 CEI conference in Spain and she told me that she was a teacher of deaf children. She explained that, in Portugal, the schools kept deaf children in classes separate from all other children. That was why their biggest problem was communication. She told me that, when she consulted with other teachers of the deaf, "We thought that, if we could have different subjects of curriculum repeating some vocabulary – it would be easier to memorize and to understand it. They chose an environmental theme and that was why they came to the CEI conference.

I later learned that Fatima guided her students on nature tours and had them ask students on their environment. In the process, the deaf students made friends with other students and became leaders when they planted trees on school property. I also learned that she helped establish the Portuguese CEI network.

I looked forward to seeing Fatima at yearly conferences because she was open to new ideas and fun-loving. We laughed a lot while on tours and in workshops. And I was delighted when evenings began with the chorus of Portuguese, who invited Caretakers to sing and dance.

How grateful I am for my friendship with Fatima and all the special moments we shared!
